Emotional Growth

- Talk about emotions.
- Children and adults grow together after shared experiences.
- Children grow more confident
- Create opportunities for child activities and events
- Provide more resources for families, not just kids, but families as a whole.
- More diverse books
- Support families through the growth of a child by being there for them and also through resources.
- Increased attendance to more groups, parent/child activities
- Flexible to each family, support for needs of family for growth
- Offer parental support groups, numerous parent/child activities that offer emotional support for all.
- Welcome anyone in the home to join the visit

- Communication and quality time
- Therapy Mental health and support
- When a child cries the parent counts 1,2,3, and takes a deep breath then asks the child what upset them
- Provides access to playgroups and interaction with peers and with other families
- Promote emotional development with the child
- Commenting about facts with caregivers, role modeling
- Interact with the families and the child and provide resources for them
- Connect with the entire family, inquire about their activities that they did during the week.
- Identify emotions before behaviors, patience, communication empathy, listening and reflecting
