ELS Training or PD Agenda	If there are no new ELSs, upload recent PD agendas. Covers family strengths, child development, parent–child interaction, child-led play, bias and cultural humility, ELS facilitation skills (family observation, strength-based comments, open-ended questions), and the “why?” behind form and assessment administration.	✓	✓
Site VISM List	Review your VISM list in DAISY (no upload needed): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Developmental sequence, progressing from 2–3-years-old</li> <li>• Open-ended + culturally representative</li> <li>• Multiple child development domain addressed: language/literacy, cognitive, motor, social-emotional, creative, cultural</li> </ul>	✓	✓
KEEP Form	Use this checklist annually to confirm your site follows the program design. Please check and respond honestly; this is to support a conversation with your sites about variance; it’s not about compliance.	✓	✓
